Park Flyer Craze...

Park Flyers have been around for quite a while now. When I first noticed them, I thought to myself yea, they are OK, but they seemed more for the beginner, plus most of my experience with electrics, was not very successful, to say the least. They were heavy, with high wing loading, and didn't have enough power to get off the ground, let alone be aerobatic. Dealing with expensive batteries, that didn't last but a very few minutes, made electrics, not my cup of tea. Being a high performance Pylon racer, that liked high



performance sport aircraft, made the little Park Flyers unappealing, & did not interest me much, just like a lot of other R/C pilots.

About two years ago, some of my racing buddies that tour the big Pylon races, started showing up to the races with various Park Flyers, and flying them before, & after the races ended. It was easy to see, they were having way too much fun, plus some these planes were very aerobatic, & some were electric high performance 3D aircraft, that I found were a real handful to fly, even for the experienced pilot. I thought to myself, now were talking. I was introduced to some new names

like IFO (indoor flying object), GWS Tiger Moth, Rare Bear, Crazy Max,

Slow Stick, Pico Stick, etc.



Gino & I started off with the GWS Pico Stick, & guickly graduated to the GWS Tiger Moth. The performance was good, but the flight time was a problem. We spent more time charging batteries, than flying. This was a real pain, so I was set on a mission to solve that problem. I was used to running Duralite Lithium Ion batteries in my pylon planes, so I headed in the Lithium direction. Lithium Ion & Polymer batteries, are still experimental for R/C use, and it is hard to get correct information, so a lot was learned by the seat of the pants. We burned up a lot of motors, batteries, & speed controllers, but finally got it figured out. Instead of getting three minute flight times, now we were experiencing half hour, to one hour flight times, with super flight performance. Now we no longer burned up motors, or speed controllers, and thanks to our new " electronic wizard club president", Kai Aiello, we no longer burned up our batteries charging them. Kai designed a Lithium Ion / Polymer charger

that would charge our batteries to peak plus, & without burning them up.

I can't begin to describe how much fun we have been having since the bugs were worked out. About fifteen of us now have GWS Slow Sticks, Tiger Moths, & IFO's. We have been flying combat, cutting streamers, busting balloons, flying formation, doing aerobatics, and just plain having fun. Now we can fly at the club field, or drive five minutes to the closest park, soccer field, or our own front yards...

Run down to Al's Hobbies and pick up a GWS Slow Stick (\$35.00 with motor), a Micro flight pack, & come out and play with us. You will never get a bigger bang for your buck... No, I will never trade my fast, loud pylon racers, and gas sport planes, for just the Park Flyers, but the little guys have certainly earned a place or two in our hanger. Some of you guys that might think the Park Flyers are silly don't know what you are missing, plus a "real" modeler; will appreciate all areas of modeling. YOU CAN DO IT! ... Mike Del Ponte
